

**CITY OF WILLERNIE
CITY COUNCIL MINUTES
MAY 17, 2017**

PRESENT: Parent, Miller, Bohnen, Baglio, Attorney-Scott McDonald, Maintenance Superintendent-Rick Paulson and Clerk-Vickie Keating.

ABSENT: Warren was excused from the May meeting.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Bohnen moved to accept the agenda as presented, Baglio seconded the motion and the agenda was approved.

MINUTES OF THE APRIL MEETING

Miller moved to approve the minutes of the April meeting as pre-read, Bohnen seconded the motion and the minutes were approved.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

No residents were present for public comments at the May meeting.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

The Council asked Officer Jamie to check on high speed turns onto Paddington where children are playing. There is a youth that has a two wheel motorized riding toy that he sits on and it is almost impossible to see the child when driving a car. The Council is concerned that this child could be hit if the cars are traveling at a high rate of speed.

Officer Jamie will check on the above issues and report back to the Council in June.

INSTALLATION OF CAMERA

The mayor presented pictures from the camera in the back and asked if the Council would be interested in purchasing a better system to view the entire building.

Parent moved to allow Paulson to research the camera's and install them so City Hall can be viewed continually. Miller seconded the motion and the motion passed.

Parent was also approached by a resident that has a neighbor with cameras on his property directed at the neighbor's property. Scott explained that there is nothing prohibiting a resident from installing cameras on their property, however, a civil harassment order is a right of all property owners if their privacy is being threatened.

METERS

All meters have been installed and the first training has taken place as of last week. Another training will take place in the next few weeks.

SEWER INCREASE

Baglio moved to increase the quarterly rate of the sewer to \$52.00 due to the increases made by the Metropolitan Council. Miller seconded the motion and the motion passed.

GRANTS

The bonding bill is still under discussion at the Capital and Miller is waiting on word about the infrastructure grant.

YARDS IN VIOLATION OF ORDINANCES

The current violators have all been working on the property to clean it up. There are several other residents that have not addressed their property and they will be receiving letters, having 30 days for clean-up and then fines will be issued.

Baglio will send the information to the Clerk and the letters will be sent.

GOLF TOURNAMENT

Parent redid the brochure for the 2017 tournament. Miller is in contact with Applewood Golf Course, Roma Market is waiting for the brochures and the posters will be made in the next few weeks. Miller is sending letters to the business owner's for donations as in the previous years.

RICK REPORT

Rick reported that the dock is in, the streets are swept, the leaf-vac is done until fall and the mowing has been done in the parks.

APPROVAL OF THE BILLS

Miller moved to approve the bills, Bohnen seconded the motion and the bills were approved.

ADJOURNMENT

Bohnen moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:51 p.m. Baglio seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned.
